Sadly less than 2 years later, at the Spridget celebration at Burghley, Lin could not recognise us.

ME AND MY CAR(S): STEVE AND KATH EVEREST

We have recently moved from Sussex (Southern Counties Centre) to Norfolk, (Eastern Centre) so as requested by Rob, here is a quick look at our cars, starting with the Big Healey, 222HAE.

I acquired my 1960 3000 Mk1 BN7 car in 2002. It took a fair bit of time to find the right car as at that time there were a lot of people trying to sell Healeys, that needed a lot doing to them, for over inflated prices. Having literally travelled from one end of the country to the other looking for a Mk3 BJ8 car, I decided to widen the search for other models.

Trawling through one of the many magazines, I found a Mk1 BN7 2-seater car for sale at a Rolls Royce and Bentley dealership in Henley on Thames. No, it wasn't a typo, they were selling the Healey on behalf of a client who had stored it with them while he was working in the USA. Armed with information and tips on what to look for on earlier cars provided by Healey restoration specialist, Kevin Law of Orchard Restorations, I went to Henley to take look at the car.

Without a doubt, it was the best car I'd seen. A look under bonnet to check the numbers proved that everything was in order and that it was one of just 157 BN7 2-seater right hand drive cars built for the home market.



The test drive went very well: I didn't end up with a mangled stump of a finger while checking for scuttle/door shake! The choke was sticking and there were a couple of other issues, all of which the owner agreed to have fixed.

I collected 222 HAE on 23rd December 2002. In the intervening 18 years, I've covered some 40,000 miles almost trouble-free miles. I'm a firm believer that our cars are there to be driven. I've attended umpteen Healey rallies including the 2nd, 3rd and 4th European events.

The engine was rebuilt by Kevin and his team in 2017. Bill McDonough of Hardy Engineering has rebuilt the gear box in 2008 and last year, exchanged the original 3.9 differential for a 3.5 version. The replacement diff really does give the car great touring capabilities.

I spent my working life as an electrical engineer, so I have converted the lighting on the car to L.E.D. throughout. Let's face it, 50/55watt lamps, even halogen ones are no match for today's modern cars coming the other way at night! As the original headlamp reflectors were suffering from corrosion, I replaced them with 'pilot/side' lamp versions. This allowed me to install discreet, relay-controlled daylight running lights (DRL's). I can now be seen during the day as well!! I've retained the original dynamo, so the reduction in power consumption from the battery is a big help. The improved level of lighting at night was well worth the effort.

As always, there are plenty of jobs to be getting on with on the car, but that's all part of the fun of owning them isn't it?
