### DAVE'S TECHNICAL TIPS

Work on the BJ8 continues painfully slowly and I now have another unplanned job, taking the gearbox out. As part of the re-commissioning I am changing to silicon brake fluid so a flush out and new seals are the order of the day.

The gaiter on the clutch lever was split so due for a change but when I removed it bits of a spring fell out of the gaiter. They add up to that little coil that holds the thrust bearing in place, it is really annoying as the car drove nicely and the clutch worked well so I wasn't expecting that job.



I can't get an endoscope into the right position to see if there are retainers in place [I was hoping it might be left over bits from a previous clutch change] so for peace of mind I am going to have to take the box out.

On the plus side I haven't put the dash and steering wheel back on yet so at least I have a bit of space to attack the offending item. There has been some progress though, I think I have finished tidying up the wiring loom, it had been chopped against the chassis in the past during an off road excursion in Scotland, I have made a permanent repair and added a wire for brake lights to enable separate indicators at the rear [it is an early BJ8] and included a permanent feed from the battery to a 12v socket to enable easy charging. EBay supplied a nice double socket with a 12v socket and a double usb which I will be wiring through the ignition.

I have made the steel pod (R) to hold these which doubles up as the support for the glove box so they should be reasonably well hidden from sight so won't offend any purists!



# SOCIAL WHEELS OCTOBER 2020

If THEY can find a reliable, safe way of protecting everyone we may get to see a sensible program for next summer, but so far this seems a fairly distant possibility.

In the meantime, keep your lovely Healeys in tip top condition and enjoy the sunshine when we get some. The weather this year has been so good and it makes a mockery of all the events so carefully planned and forced to be abandoned.

Here is to 2021, with the virus beaten into submission and a full summer of events to make up for all we have missed. Never before have I wished the year away, and whilst for me personally there have been some surprising and welcome happenings, I know many have had to deal with hardship and tragic loss, so hopefully a new year will bring better fortune to us all.

# THE GOLDEN HEALEY

Last month I mentioned Ken Gregory's book, 'Behind the scenes of motor racing' and in passing that Ken had been responsible for the 1958 100/6 show car that has become known as 'Goldie'. Here is the relevant passage from his book:

With Casablanca the 1958 Grand Prix season ended, and apart from the Boxing Day Brands Hatch meeting, we could now turn our minds to things other than motor racing. The Earl's Court Motor Show at the latter end of October commanded my immediate attention once I was back from North Africa.

At that time I still retained my post as Public Relations Officer for Donald Healey, and I had for some time been considering how best to tackle the eternal problem of Earl's Court—that is, to attract the crowd to your stand and keep them there. Faced with the publicity guns of 'the big five', who between them were bringing out various brand-new models just before the Motor Show, it was obvious that we would need something pretty eye-opening to draw the crowds away from their stands.

In other words, putting it bluntly, we needed a 'gimmick'. My contention was that if, by some means or other, I could create sufficient interest in the Austin-Healey exhibits to bring the public to the stand, it was then up to the salesmen to make use of the opportunity, and 'push' the Company's wares. We needed something so glittering and attractive that people would make a point of visiting the stand specially to see it.

So was born the 'Gold, Mink and Ivory' Austin-Healey. I put my idea to Donald Healey, who agreed it was an extremely sound one. Then, after thinking seriously about it for a few days, he decided that the cost of the venture would be prohibitive, and the idea would have to be shelved.

I felt very bitter about this, and accordingly asked him whether, assuming I could guarantee a purchaser of the special car at a fixed price, he would then be prepared to build the car and carry out all the special treatment it would require.

'Yes,' said Donald; under those circumstances he would, so I then approached Basil Cardew, motoring correspondent of the *Daily Express*. We had a discussion in a Fleet Street pub one evening, as a result of which Basil put the idea to his editor that their newspaper should purchase the car and announce it to be the first prize in a Motor Show competition they were promoting.

## Goldie continued...

Having obtained their agreement to this proposal, I went back to Donald Healey, who undertook to begin work immediately on the special Austin-Healey. The car itself was basically an ordinary 'Hundred-Six' de Luxe model, but the entire coachwork was painted in a beautiful ivory shade. Everything that was normally chromed was 24-carat gold-plated, right down to the tiniest trimming washers and screws; the wire wheels, disc brakes, bumpers and instruments were all given the same treatment.

The seats were made of a reversed champagne kid leather with pure mink insets on the seat and the back squab, while the dashboard and the complete side trim embodied reversed champagne kid. All instrument controls and other parts normally of plastic were made of solid ivory, as was the steering wheel, which was an absolute masterpiece of the craftsman's art. The ignition key was gold-plated, also the key ring on which was a tiny, but true-to-scale, 24-carat solid gold miniature of the Austin-Healey Hundred-Six.

The 'Golden' Austin-Healey was valued at around £4000 (A new 100/6 was £1223), and suffice to say proved a sensation at Earl's Court, 1958; it gained some very good press reports and generous publicity, and drew masses of visitors to the Austin-Healey stand, which was the object of the exercise.

Geoffrey Healey in his inimitable way was not so sure:

'Austin specially finished a 100 Six for the Earls Court Motor Show. All plated parts were plated in gold and the seats were trimmed in mink. Some metallurgists were alarmed by the gold plating of the wheels, as this could have caused spoke failure'.

### CLASSICS AT GLEMHAM 2020

With so many shows, events and rallies cancelled it was hardly surprising that the Glemham event was a sell out. A wide range of classic and modern classic vehicles plus a smattering of vintage transport made its way to Suffolk and the grounds of Glemham Hall, between Woodbridge & Saxmundham on the A12.

This was the second year of the event and the near 100% attendance seemed to cause a bit of traffic chaos in the A12. Once on site it was a slow and careful procession for my <u>1959 3000</u> Mk1 'Ruby' following a Daimler Dart and being tailed by a NYPD police cruiser to our spot for the day.



The weather played its part and soon it was time for tea and bacon rolls before heading out to look at the 1000+ classics.

Amongst the ranks of visitors there were a good few Austin Healeys, with a healthy contingent of Sprites (one 193 XVK on its first outing since restoration) and a few 100-4's, 100-6 and some later MK2 and MK3 3000's.



No club stand meant we were all scattered around the show but each took time to stop when we found a fellow Healey.

Despite my own car being surrounded by more modern American muscle (one with Lambo doors) I certainly had a steady stream of admirers one of whom commented she was a rose between two thorns!
